Highlights of the March Board Meeting:

The village board approved the following:

- \*Temporary Class B License to the Hilbert Lions Club for the 4<sup>th</sup> of July picnic.
- \*Conditionally approved the cost share agreement with the Hilbert Athletic Association for the new ballfield light project.
- \*Conditionally awarded the bid for the ballfield light project to Bodart Electric for \$102,000 based upon getting the cost share agreement signed.
- \*Donation to the Eastshore Humane Association of \$200.

- \*Verbal report on the firemen's convention attended.
- \*The village is currently working with the Town of Rantoul to do drainage improvements on Irish Rd which would help with some of the flooding issues we have had in previous years. We are also exploring options on the southwest side of the village which would help with flooding issues in these areas.

## CALUMET COUNTY CLEAN SWEEP PROGRAM

Advanced Disposal Landfill and Calumet County are teaming up to offer several Hazardous Waste Clean Sweep collection sites which are free for residents and farmers, and at a reduced-cost for businesses. Electronics are accepted at a cost of \$1.00 per item. Residents and farmers from throughout Calumet County can deliver hazardous wastes to the Town of Harrison Garage at the intersection of Highway 114 and State Park Road from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. Saturday, April 20, or to the New Holstein Public Works Garage at the intersection of Taft St. and Mason Ave. on Saturday, May 11 from 8:00 to 11:00 a.m. Any Calumet County business that is regulated as a small quantity generator of hazardous waste is eligible to participate in any of the Clean Sweep programs for a fee. For participation details, contact the UW Extension office. Hazardous wastes are products whose labels include the words caution, poison, combustible, danger, warning, flammable, or corrosive. Hazardous wastes that can be brought to the Clean Sweep include, but are not limited to, solvents, fertilizers, pesticides and herbicides (including DDT and chlordane), rodent baits, lead and oil based paints, kitchen and bathroom cleaners, bug sprays, and auto products such as used oil, old gasoline, transmission fluid and antifreeze. Latex paint IS NOT ACCEPTED. ## ***RESOLVE TO BE READY IN 2013***

The STATE OF WISCONSIN Division of Emergency Management has a program this year called RESOLVE TO BE READY IN 2013.

Get ready for emergencies by taking these important steps:

1. Get an emergency kit.
2. Make an emergency plan.
3. Be informed about the type of emergencies that can happen in Wisconsin and how to respond.
4. Have a NOAA emergency weather radio tuned in for immediate alerts to danger.
5. Have flashlights and extra batteries.
6. Having food, water, medications, first aid kit and battery powered radios with extra batteries is essential.

### ***FROM THE VILLAGE OF HILBERT EMERGENCY GOVERNMENT:***

It was brought to our attention after the power outage that the village experienced last year that there were residents in the village whose oxygen generator went empty and those needed oxygen couldn't call out for help because their telephones didn't work either. Because of HIPPA privacy laws, your health care provider cannot tell us who in our village falls under this situation. Because of this we are asking for your help. The village desires to make up a list of everyone in the village that is currently on oxygen. The goal desired here is that in the event of an electrical outage or other emergency, we can reference this list and make sure that we follow up with those individuals and provide assistance to ensure that their lives are not put at risk. Please contact the clerk's office at 920-853-3241 to have your name placed on the list. Also, in the event of an emergency and you need to reach someone after hours, the village's after hours or emergency number is 920-418-3272. We are looking to get all affected residents on the list so if you know someone or have a neighbor under this situation, please pass this information onto them so that they can contact the village.
