PROGRAM UPDATE

Right now, there is not a lot to report as to changes to our recycling program. The switch to the single stream recycling may seem like a distant memory, but we feel that it has been a real benefit to our recycling program. We feel that the program has had a positive effect on the amount of recycling being processed because the amount of effort in preparing the recyclables has decreased. There are options for residents who have difficulty in fitting the amount of recyclables into one container each month. You can obtain an additional container which would only add \$18 to the annual cost. The state did up the funding for 2017 so we are hoping that we will be able to secure more in grant funds for the current year.

CLEAN SWEEP & ELECTRONICS RECYCLING

Appointments are REQUIRED to participate, and openings are limited to 50 participating households per event. YARD WASTE

Please remember that we still have our compost site available for residents to drop off their brush and yard waste. This program is for residents of the village only and is not open to anyone outside of the village even if they have a Hilbert mailing address. Please keep an eye open and if they see someone that is not a village resident bringing in yard waste of brush, please grab a license plate number along with the date and we will contact them to educate them about this facility only being available for village residents. There are continued issues with dumping the compost material and brush on the wrong piles. This material must be dumped on the proper pile. There is a sign that indicates which pile you need to dump the material on. This area is not a dumping ground for other materials such as concrete, brick, garbage, etc. If you have concrete material that needs to be disposed of, it can be done at the wastewater treatment plant by appointment. We recycle the concrete there and use the recycled material as base in our projects. Please contact the clerk's office

to make arrangements. Also please remember to keep all grass clippings out of the roads as the weather starts to warm up and we begin to think about cutting our lawns again. It is against current ordinance and if we have to clean it up out of the gutters, you would be billed accordingly. Lastly, we will chip brush up to 4" in diameter. If you have brush that needs to be chipped, you can either haul it to the compost site and place the brush on the brush pile. If it is a small amount of brush, we ask that you haul it to the compost site. We can also chip on site for larger quantities. You must contact the clerk's office at 853-3241 to request the chipping at your property. We usually chip once a week on Wednesdays. If you do not call to have the brush picked up and chipped, it will not be done.

SPRING CLEAN

The annual Spring Clean will again be held this year. We will be having the drop off site again in the gravel parking lot across the street from the fire station/community center. Items will not be picked up at the curbing. The event is scheduled for Saturday, May 6th from 8 a.m. – 11 a.m. No material will be picked up if it is left out on the curb area. The committee will again be on site to assist you. Following is the list of acceptable and non-acceptable items:

TIRE RECYCLING EVENT

The Eastshore Recycling Commission is hosting a tire recycling event. It will be held from 8 a.m. – noon on Saturday, April 22, 2017. The site will be the parking lot at Officials Den (bowling alley) at 408 N. 8th St. You will be required to purchase tickets in advance of the event. Please see the attached flyer for more information.

ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR COLLECTION

- *Household items such as couches, chairs, tables, lamps, sinks and toilets.
- *Carpeting, rugs, pads from carpeting. All carpeting/pad material should be cut down to 4' lengths and tied for ease of handling.
- *Bedsprings, mattresses, bed frames, swing sets and wash line poles (with concrete removed from the poles) and bicycles.
- *Freon free appliances (i.e. washers, dryers, stoves, water heaters, water softeners and dishwashers.
- *Any NON-HAZARDOUS household refuse that is bagged or bundled.
- *Scrap Metals.

NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS FOR COLLECTION

- *No refrigerators, freezers or dehumidifiers under any circumstances, even if the freon has been removed.
- *No microwaves.
- *No E-Waste, such as computers, monitors, any computer accessories, televisions, VCR/DVD/DVR players, telephones, fax machines or any electronic item.
- *No residential recycling items.
- *No gasoline-powered engines.
- *No construction and remodeling debris (such as plaster, shingles, siding). These items require a dumpster.
- *No yard waste
- *No fluorescent light bulbs and household hazardous materials (chemicals, paints, spray cans, etc.)
- *No tires or batteries.
