





The agenda for the hearing is:

- 1. Identification of total potential funds**
- 2. Eligible CDBG activities**
- 3. Presentation of identified community development needs**
- 4. Identification of community development needs by the public**
- 5. A presentation of the proposed project for the Village's application, including any potential residential displacement**
- 6. Citizen input regarding proposed and other eligible CDBG activities**

Although limited at this time, more information on the proposed project is available at the Village Hall during regular business hours

There will also be a presentation on the Northeastern Housing Rehabilitation CDBG Loan Program. The program can assist low and moderate-income households with needed repairs, including door/window replacement, plumbing/electrical and other repairs that improve the quality of living. Loans are offered at 0% interest and payments can be deferred until the home is sold. Household income limits are based on household size and will be discussed at the meeting. For example, a 4-person household that qualifies as low and moderate-income is one having a total income of \$59,050 or less [based on current data].
