PROGRAM UPDATE

It's very hard to believe that we are at the end of another year with the Christmas Holiday Season almost upon us! It seems like just yesterday that we were talking of warmer weather and greener grass.

As we enter the winter season which some people enjoy and others do not and as you finish up shopping for Christmas and you were wondering if you were naughty or nice and will receive the latest in electronics on Christmas Day, we again want to remind you that disposing electronics with your regular garbage is prohibited by law. There are several local businesses that will take electronics. Some of the businesses do charge a fee for disposing of the electronic which is never popular, but it is a far better option for the environment than it is to dispose of the items. The garbage haulers do monitor the garbage as the carts are dumped and they can actually see if there are items being disposed that are prohibited such as electronics. There are also avenues for donating your used cell phones so that they can be given out to the elderly so that they can call 911 when they need to. Most cell phone retail outlets will take your old cell phones for this program. There will also be programs sponsored by the county for you to properly dispose of your electronics. These are listed on the same page as the garbage and recycling pick up dates. There will also be several hazardous waste pick up dates sponsored by the county in 2018. I have listed these dates also with the other pick up schedules for easy reference.

After the hustle and bustle of the holiday season and as you see the needles from your real Christmas tree begin to accumulate on the floor, you may be thinking why did I purchase a real tree and now I need to get this out of the house without losing too many more needles. We will again pick up Christmas trees after this holiday season. Please remember that the trees must be placed by the curb and all decorations, wires, bows, lights, etc. must be removed. If these guidelines are not followed, your tree will not be picked up. The deadline for picking up the trees will be **Monday, January 15, 2018**. No trees will be picked up after this time. The village employees will make every effort to pick up the trees in a timely manner but we are the mercy of Mother Nature. We will not pick up Christmas Wreaths. Because of the amount of wires on them, we cannot chip them. Please dispose of them with your regular garbage. Any wreaths placed out on the curbing will not be picked up. Also attached to this letter is a very useful summary guideline summary on how to properly prepare your recyclables and what is accepted or not with our single stream recycling program.

COMPOST SITE

We ask that you continually take care of disposing compost material properly. There are signs down at the site that instruct you which pile is the proper location to dump your compost material and brush. Please make sure not to leave behind bags, boxes, etc. that you may have used to bring the compost material to the site. These items are supposed to be taken with you and disposed with your regular garbage. Please also remember that we can only accept brush up to 4" in diameter. If there is a need to have the brush picked up (this is for larger quantities only), we ask that you contact the clerk's office to get on the list. We also ask that you remove all root balls from the brush and bushes. We cannot run those through the chipper.

TIRE RECYCLING

There will be a tire recycling event held in Hilbert on Saturday, April 21, 2018 from 9 a.m. – 11 a.m. at Officials Den at 408 N. 8th St. A flyer is attached which provides details of this event.

Place items loose in your cart.

No plastic bags and no binder twine or string!

Plastic

ACCEPT:

- ALL plastic bottles, cups & containers
- Household bottles, jars & jugs
- Dairy containers & lids
- Produce, bakery & deli containers & lids

DO NOT ACCEPT:

- Plastic bags, wrap or film
- Motor oil bottles
- Styrofoam



empty, rinse and replace caps & lids

Paper

ACCEPT:

- Newspapers & inserts
- Cardboard & paperboard (food boxes)
- Milk, juice & soup cartons
- Office & school paper
- Junk mail & catalogs
- Phonebooks, books & magazines

DO NOT ACCEPT:

- Tissue paper
- Pet food bags



shred paper in a paper bag & staple shut
flatten & cut boxes to 2ft by 2ft

Metal

ACCEPT:

- Aluminum bottles & cans
- Steel & tin cans
- Empty aerosol cans

DO NOT ACCEPT:

- Aluminum pans or foil
- Empty paint cans
- Scrap metal



empty & rinse

Glass

ACCEPT:

- Food and beverage bottles & jars

DO NOT ACCEPT:

- Window glass
- Ceramics, china
- Drinking glasses
